Mini Camp hours are 10:00 am to 12:00 pm (noon). Children and their caregivers should be prepared to hike outside and on the trails on any given day. Appropriate footwear is mandatory (no sandals or flip-flops).

Peek into the Past

Tuesday - Thursday, July 11-13

This week is literally millions of years in the making! Journey back in time as we search for clues about dinosaurs that once roamed the land before the Greenbelt, learn how horses helped people travel throughout history, and how dragonflies have taken to the skies for over 300 million years.
